What You Need to Know

- If you are fully vaccinated, you can start doing many things that you had stopped doing because of the pandemic.
- When choosing safer activities, consider how COVID-19 is spreading in your community, the number of people participating in the activity, and the location of the activity.
- Outdoor visits and activities are safer than indoor activities, and fully vaccinated people can participate in some indoor events safely, without much risk.
- If you haven't been vaccinated yet, find a vaccine.

Outdoor Activities:

Safest	Walk, run, wheelchair roll, or bike outdoors with members of your household	Safest
Safest	Attend a small, outdoor gathering with fully vaccinated family and friends	Safest

Less Safe	Dine at an outdoor restaurant with friends from multiple households	Safest

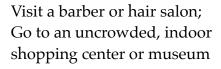

True Peace

True peace is not a détente or a refusal to engage in conversation out of fear of division. True peace is when we love and respect one another enough that we seek to understand each other, and upon recognizing our differences still affirm that we are brothers and sisters.

True peace is when we are willing to get outside of our comfort zone to speak directly with one another rather than about one another.

It is not peace to just not talk about our differences. This is tantamount to two armies calling a truce but still harboring animosity toward each other; each ready to pounce if the other is perceived as violating the truce.

True peace is present when our values of loving-kindness and empathetic consideration outweigh our need to be right and our fears of difference. When we can respond to one another with caring eyes, open hearts, and embracing arms, after fully listening to each other and recognizing that we each hold views that the other views as abhorrent, then we are building a community of true peace.

When everyone of us can affirm the inherent worth of the other and seek our adversary's best interests along with our own and those of others, while nonviolently opposing the policies we find hurtful to the prospects of peace, justice, and compassion, then we will realize the blessings of living in true peace.
