


PULPIT SUPPLY

MOMENT FOR MISSIONS: STRENGTHEN THE CHURCH OFFERING



Every year, the United Church of Christ's Strengthen the Church offering supports more than a dozen new and renewing spiritual communities through Congregational Assessment, Support and Advancement (CASA) grants. In 2022, a grant sent to Taos United Community Church, a small church in the Southwest Conference allowed the congregants to continue to minister to their community and to each other after they unexpectedly lost their founding pastor to cancer.

Taos United Community Church is one of 15 spiritual communities supported last year by \$225,000 in CASA grants, all made possible because of UCC members' gifts to the annual Strengthen the Church offering, taken traditionally on Pentecost. The missional gifts Taos UCC received not only kept the church community from closing its doors, but also aided in the healing process and allowed them to emerge even stronger from the devastating loss of their founding pastor.
