

GRIN & GROW IS GROWING MINDS

This year is a special year for our organization. We are celebrating 80 years of service to the community. This is an exceptionally long tenure for a private nonprofit. Although, it is nowhere close to our partners The First Congregational Church of Waterloo (167 years) who have been instrumental in our success over the last 20 years.

It is because of the critical service to the community we provide and the partnerships we have shared that we have been able to survive the ups and downs. As part of our service to the community we have to adapt so that we remain reflective of what is most needed. In our case that might consist of rearranging classrooms and moving teachers. Most recently for us it means a re-brand. We will begin doing business as **Growing Minds Early Learning Center**. Our focus of providing affordable and accessible child care to families who may not have access to other high-quality options will not change.

We wanted our new name to recognize that we also often offer programs that go beyond just child care, such as early education and developmental support. These programs can help support children's cognitive, social-emotional, and physical development and promote school readiness. Furthermore, we hope to offer a sense of stability and support to families who may be facing other challenges. We can be a hub for other community resources and services, connecting families to essential supports that they may not have access to otherwise.

I have always said that all children deserve the best care. I think we have been able to hold ourselves to this high standard because of the support of partners like First Congregational. Thank you!
